

What is a Parent Partnership Service?

Every Local Authority has to have a parent partnership service to give information, help and support to families of children with SEN (Special Education Needs).

Lancashire County Council's service has staff based in Accrington, Lancaster and Preston and aims to provide parents and carers with accurate and neutral information on all aspects of SEN.



What the Parent Partnership Service does?

The Parent Partnership Service aims to:-

- Encourage parents of children with SEN to play an active role in their child's education.
- Provide parents with accurate and neutral information on all aspects of SEN policy and procedures.
- Offer individual support to parents during the educational assessment process.
- Improve communication between the local authority, parents, schools and other professionals.
- Provide training courses for parents on SEN issues and offer support groups in your area.
- Assist parents by providing support and information about SEN related admission and exclusion issues.
- Encourage links between parents and voluntary groups and organisations.
- Encourage and support schools in further developing their links with parents.
