Strike Action Arrangements

This is an excerpt from the letter sent on Tuesday regarding the strike action.

Arrangements for Wednesday 1st February

On this day we have some staff striking so there will be a partial school closure. When a member of staff is striking the class will not be in school and work will not be set. The child can utilise Timestables Rockstar, Spelling frame or complete their reading for this day, but this is optional.

If you child's class is not in school they will not be marked as absent. Any dinner money or payments for wrap around care will automatically be credited to you. Morning club and after school club will be open as normal.

Homework

In September, I outlined the expectations of homework for each child across school and most children have met theses expectations. Thank you for your support in achieving this. As we start a new term, I thought it would be good just to reiterate these expectations, so that everyone is fully aware of them.

Our expectations were based on research from the Educational Endowment Foundation which suggested homework should be based on prior learning, follow a set pattern, have an element of quick feedback and that IT packages have the biggest impact. We therefore developed the homework table below.

The homework we set is linked to the learning the children engage with in school and completing it has a very positive effect on their progress. Most primary school children need support to complete their homework and we are asking for your support in this.

Our expectation is that all homework is done. Staff will check homework on a Monday morning. If homework is completed the children will get team points. If a piece of homework is not completed the child will get a warning. If homework is not complete 2 weeks in a row or 3 times in a half-term, parents will receive an email from the class teacher to inform them. If a consistent pattern of not doing homework emerges, school will contact parents to discuss how we could support you further in ensuring your child completes their homework.

If you still owe for last term, Mrs Golding will be contacting you imminently!


